Noun - A noun is a word that identifies:

a person (man, girl, engineer, friend)

a thing (horse, wall, flower, country)

an idea, feeling, quality, or state (anger, courage, life, luckiness)
```

#### Who can identify the noun?

Sam was playing in the garden.

My friend had a beautiful doll.

We live in West Bridgford.

Verb - A verb describes what a person or thing does or what happens. It's a doing word.

For example, verbs describe:

an action-jump, stop, explore

an event-happen

a situation-be, seem, have

a change-evolve, shrink, widen

### Who can identify the verb?

I want you to skip to the fence and back.

The magician's rabbit disappeared.

The rain began to fall heavily.

Adjective - An adjective is a word that describes a noun, giving extra information about it. For example:

an exciting adventure

a green apple

a tidy room

We can have more than adjective to describe something.

## Who can identify the adjective?

The noisy parrot was blue and yellow.

The messy classroom was full of happy children.

The tall, bushy tree was swaying in the wind.

Adverb - An adverb is a word that's used to add information about a verb, adjective, or other adverb:

The mostly end in 'ly'

- they sang loudly
- she's very pretty
- he writes really well


### Who can identify the adverb?

Conjunction - A conjunction (also called a connective) is a word such as and, because, but, for, if, or, and when. Conjunctions are used to connect phrases and sentences.
