
What is transport?

Transport is a means of getting from one place to another. There are lots of different types of **transport**.

Did you think of any of these?




The transport we see today hasn't always looked the same, or even worked in the same way...





Our transport timeline

The past!

What do we call the time we are in right now?

The present!

- What is the date today? The month? Year?
- This is the **present** and this is our starting point
- In future lessons we will be working backwards at how and why transport has changed

Tram

How does it move?

Electricity.
This comes from the power lines above the tram.

What does it travel on?

Tram lines!
Some trams also go onto train tracks.
Tram lines run along roads and can often be driven on by cars too.

Where does it allow us to go?

Around one area like a city or town.

Not all cities have trams but

Nottingham does!

Who controls it?

There is a driver at the front.

You don't buy your ticket from the driver, you have to buy it before you get on.
