Hi everyone!
Over the next couple of weeks we are going to be looking at compound words and polysyllabic words.

Polysyllabic words are words with more than 1 syllable. Remember a syllable is how many claps there are in a word. 'Miss' = 1 clap, but 'Whitney' $=2$ claps. How many claps does your name have?

Compound words also have more than one syllable, but they are special words because they are two words...stuck together to make a new word! For example:
foot + ball $=$ football class + room $=$ classroom
Be careful though, because not all words can be put together to make a compound word! There's no such thing as a handnose is there?!
