

# Heymann Homeworking Menu - Year 1 - Week Beginning: 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020



In the table, there are lots of different homework activities to choose from.

You must complete the green boxes each week.

At least one 4-star activity should be completed each week. You can choose to do whatever you like each week. However, you must try to earn 20 stars by the end of the week. When you have completed an activity and a parent has checked it, you can colour the number of stars you have achieved.

<p><b>English:</b> Read a book for ten minutes, five days a week. (you will get one star for each day you complete the task)</p> <p>★</p>	<p><b>Phonics:</b> Complete the phoneme spotter sheet on the Year 1 website. Read the story on the sheet, then circle the words which contain the ‘air’ trigraph. Challenge: Can you think of any more words containing the ‘air’ trigraph? Can you use them in a sentence?</p> <p>★★</p>	<p><b>English:</b> Read the story of “The Enormous Turnip”: <a href="#">Link to story</a> Answer the questions about the story, these can be found on the Year 1 webpage.</p> <p>★★★</p>	<p><b>English:</b> Practise your Heymann handwriting in your exercise book. You will get one star for each day you complete the task). Focus on “Common Exception Words” – there is a full list of these on the Year 1 webpage.</p> <p>★</p>
<p><b>Reading:</b> Complete the reading assessment, then read a book online using the <a href="#">Scholastic Reading Pro website</a>.  Parents, details of how to log on have been emailed to you separately.</p> <p>★★</p>	<p><b>DT/Art:</b> Following on from your research about Cadbury, can you design your own chocolate bar? 1. Make a plan. Which ingredients will you choose for your secret recipe? Can you draw and label it? 2. Design the wrapper. What will it be called? 3. Reuse packaging, wrapping paper or anything else you have to hand to build a model/collage of your chocolate bar.</p> <p>★★★★</p>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Complete your daily ten a day Maths. Children – try to read the word problems out loud independently, before working out your answer.
