Phonics – ar, or, ur

Over the, week feel free to try these simple phonics lessons with your child. They should also find these sounds on their THRASS chart and have a THRASS chart to hand to help their learning. You could also be using https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources and going on tricky word trucks and flash card speed trial phase 2/3 to check how your child is doing. Feel free to revisit any sound we have done or search Mr Thorne for some different sounds. It is just a case of thinking up simple words and sentences that use the sound you want to look at.

Day One - Phonics sound 1- ar

Watch the Mr Thorne Video on ar <u>https://youtu.be/LXkE8aWfg2E</u> = practice writing this diagraph.

Activity 1: Reading

On 1 larger piece of paper draw a simple car, farmer and star. On 3 smaller pieces of paper write the words- can your child match the word to the picture?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. ("The car was going far" You can extend this by adding and if appropriate.)

Day Two - Phonics sound 2- ur

Watch the Mr Thorne Video: <u>https://youtu.be/Q49YSWKPyVo</u> - practice writing this diagraph.

Activity 1: Reading

On 1 larger piece of paper draw a simple curl, burger and some fur (you may need to point out what they are!) . On 3 smaller pieces of paper write the words- can your child match the word to the picture?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. ("The cat had long fur" You can extend this by adding and if appropriate.)

Day Three - Phonics sound 3- or

Watch the Mr Thorne Video: <u>https://youtu.be/33kvsqyOYdg</u> - practice writing this diagraph.

Activity 1 : Reading

On 1 larger piece of paper draw a simple fork, torch and storm (you may need to point out what they are!) On 3 smaller pieces of paper write the words- can your child match the word to the picture?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. ("The storm was cold" You can extend this by adding and if appropriate.)

We will be loosely revisiting phase 3 over the next few weeks but we are going to focus on reading digraphs first.
