<p>English: Read a book for ten minutes, five days a week. (you will get one star for each day you complete the task)</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Music: Can you make up a song using the fruits from Handa's Surprise? Look at the powerpoint on the Y1 webpage to find out more. You will need to listen to the tune of Frere Jacques, decide which order you are going to sing Handa's fruits to this tune, then draw pictures of the fruit in the right order to write your song!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>Whole school activity: National Geographic indoor safari</p> <p>There are over 500 types of bugs that could be living in your home! Use the National Geographic to learn what you might be sharing your house with. Look at what others are finding around the world. Have a try at identifying or drawing what you find. There are some tips on this website</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>English: Can you create your own surprise fruit/veg basket? Which fruits or vegetables would you choose to put in your basket for a friend or family member? Use your imagination on how to present this – you can make a shopping list, draw your basket, cut and stick from a magazine/newspaper, collage, make it with real fruits – it's up to you – it will not be Handa's Surprise, it will be YOUR surprise!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★★</p>
<p>Art: Using the powerpoints on the website, find out more about African fabric patterns. On a piece of paper, can you design your own repeating fabric pattern? Think about using repeating shapes like circles or triangles, and how you can colour it to show pattern.</p> <p>There are some colouring pages on the Year 1 website to help you enjoy and practise the the style through colouring!</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>MFL: Can you find out the names for each fruit or animal in a different language?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Maths: Complete your daily ten a day Maths. (you will get one star for each day you complete the task)</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Geography: Watch the Go Jettlers explore Africa films and the Kenya tourism video. Kenya is the country in which Handa's Surprise is set.</p> <p>Remember, there are lots of big modern cities in Africa as well as rural landscapes like the area where Handa lives. What is the biggest city in Africa called?</p> <p>Can you create your own funky facts page about Africa?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★★</p>

This week you will be completing Summer Term Week 6 (w/c 1st June).</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>English: Watch the video of Miss Cash reading "Handa's Surprise" on the Year 1 webpage. A film of the story can also be found here.</p> <p>Using the videos to help you, can retell the story by creating a story map? There is an example of a story map on the Year 1 webpage. You can do your story map in your home learning book or on a piece of paper. There is a template you could complete or use to help you draw out your own. Think – what happens first, which animal takes which fruit, what happens next, what happens at the end of the story? Challenge: Can you add a caption to each of your story map boxes?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★★</p>	<p>Phonics/SPaG: Complete at least one of the tasks from the "Full Stops and Capital Letters" activity pack available on the Year 1 webpage.
