Week 2 Phonics - ch sh th

Over the, week feel free to try these simple phonics lessons with your child. They should also find these sounds on their THRASS chart and have a THRASS chart to hand to help their learning. Make sure to revisit flash cards of phase 3 using the phonics play website.

Day One - Phonics sound 1- ch – find chair on the THRASS Chart

Activity 1: Reading

Write the words chip, chick and lunch (bonus word chain) can the children draw these?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. (A chick can run and jump)

Day Two - Phonics sound 2- sh

Activity 1: Reading

Write the words sheep, ship and sheets on a piece of paper. Can the children read them and draw a picture?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. (the sheep is on the grass.)

Day Three - Phonics sound 3- th

Activity 1: Reading

Write the words thin, three and thorn on a piece of paper. Can the children read them and draw a picture?

Activity 2: Writing

Have a go at writing the words with your child.

Show them how to write it in a sentence or encourage them to do this independently. I can see three sheep.
