WALT: To understand what tribal life is like in the rainforest WILF: I can explain what tribal life is like by:
Bronze- organise information/pictures into categories
Silver- labelling key information/pictures
Gold- creating a text box explaining life in the rainforest
Platinum- Using subordinating conjunctions or fronted
adverbials in explanation

For your English activity, we would like you to understand what tribal life was like for the Yanomami. First, stick (or draw!) the pictures into the box you think they fit in. If you would like to challenge yourself, try and add a subordinating conjunction or fronted adverbial.
