Will you go to the arctic, the rainforest or under the sea?</p>  <p>★★★★</p>	<p><b>Thinking about school-</b> Draw a picture of what you are most looking forward to doing in your new Reception class. You can share your pictures with us on your Teams assignments page. <b>If you are in school this week we will do this task with you.</b></p>  <p>★★★★</p>	<p><b>Dinosaur Rap</b> – Check out this dinosaur rap from barefoot books. <p><b>Strengthen your fingers by creating a 'peg-a-saurus'.</b> Draw a dinosaur shape onto cereal box card. Carefully cut it out, making sure a grown up helps. Use clothes pegs to make the dinosaurs back plates (spikes). Remember to use your 'snappy' fingers to open and close the pegs.</p>  <p>★★★★</p>	<p><b>I am independent checklist</b> – Complete the check list at home with an adult. What are you already good at? What do you still need to work on before September?</p> <p><b>You don't need to print the sheet, talking about the skills that are important for Reception is just as good.</b></p>  <p>★★★★</p>	<p><b>Play an estimating game-</b> Put some small items into a pot. You could use pennies, Lego or small toys. With a grown up, take it in turns to get a handful of objects and compare them. Who has more? Who has fewer? How many do you think you have? Count the objects and see if you were right!</p>  <p>★★</p>	<p><b>Whole school task - International Sunglasses Day 27th June 2020</b></p> <p>Use the template or create your own sunglasses. There is a PowerPoint that explains the importance of sun safety and wearing sunglasses to protect your eyes.</p>  <p>★★★★</p>
