Research has shown that people who do not wear sunglasses risk doing substantial damage to their eyes due to the harmful effects of the sun's rays. Even on cloudy days, sunlight can still be strong enough to cause lasting damage to the eyes, which means that it is important to wear sunglasses or another form of UV eye protection at all times.
