

- Now we are in Phase 4, we learn to read and spell words that have consonant blends (also called adjacent consonants), which means there are 2 separate consonant sounds next to each other. E.g. belt, vest, clap, flat. 'Duck' does not have a consonant blend, because the ck at the end only makes one sound.
- This week we are going to practice words that have a consonant blend at the end first (e.g. vest, belt) and then look at words that have a consonant blend at the beginning.
- Work through the activities on this PowerPoint and then have a go at the activity afterwards.
