- I understand that tengo means I have.
- I can put together a whole sentence to say which pets I have.
- I understand that no tengo means I don't have.

Hola. If you are able, please play this powerpoint through, and listen to the children saying the Spanish for the animals. Can you join in, and repeat each word at least 3 times?

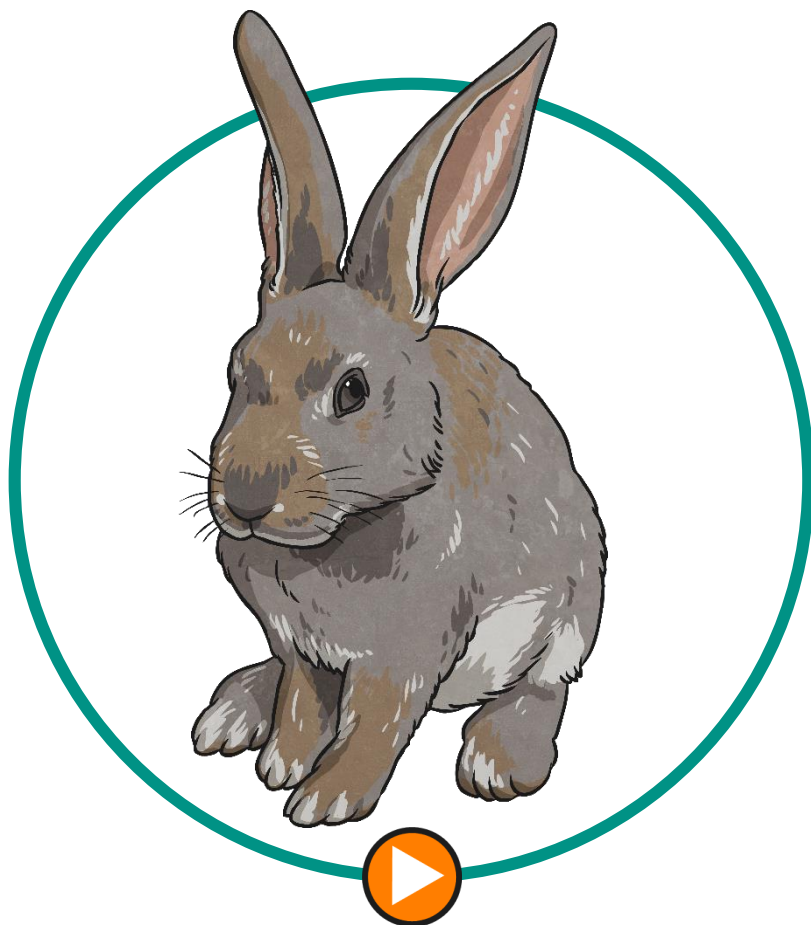
