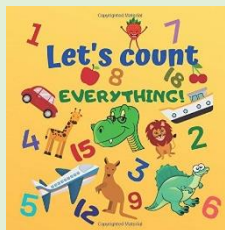
Ongoing Activities



Share books and stories: This week we are sharing stories that feature winter. Do you have any winter story books at home? If not, you can access lots online or you could even make up your own wintery story.

Count everything and anything!

It could be the toys you are playing with, how many stairs there are in your house or even how many vegetables you have left on your plate!



Try to make into a game/as fun as possible e.g. 'I bet you can't count how many dinosaurs you have?'

How does winter feel?

Look at PowerPoint (attached to this week's page) watch the videos and talk with a grown-up- what do you notice about winter? What do you and your family like to do when it is cold outside? Are there any special clothes we need to wear?



Go on a winter walk- how does the air feel? What do you notice about the trees- do they have any leaves on? Can you spot any flowers?

Exploring ice

Can you make ice? Choose some different shaped containers, pour in some water, and put them in the freezer. Keep checking at different intervals- 30minutes/1 hour/2 hours – what is happening to the water?



You could try to melt the ice afterwards- see what happens when you add salt/warm water.
