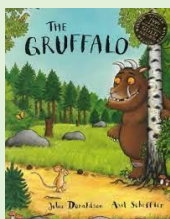
Ongoing Activities



Share books and stories:

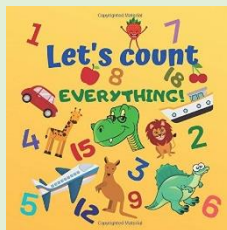
This week we are sharing 'The Gruffalo' story by Julia Donaldson – watch Miss Shaw's video – can you join in with the
