'I wonder' questions:

- I wonder what might be dangerous for this lost sheep?
- I wonder why the shepherd cares so much for the sheep?
- I wonder if the lost sheep matters more than the other sheep?
- I wonder what being lost feels like? Why? (link to children's own experiences)
- I wonder if being lost is always about not knowing where we are – are there other kinds of 'lost' too? (e.g. lost toys, lost thoughts) – how do you feel when you've lost/found something

Do the children understand why this story matters to Christians?

Can the children link or relate their own experience to the story?
