

Tuesday - Phonics

Today we are thinking about the long /oo/ but this phoneme (sound) can be spelled in different ways (e.g. **moon**, **screw** and **glue**).

1. Sometimes the /**ew**/ phoneme makes the /oo/ sound like in 'g**rew**' or the /**yoo**/ sound like in 'news'. Watch Mr Thorne [here](#).

The long /oo/ sound usually comes in the middle of words.



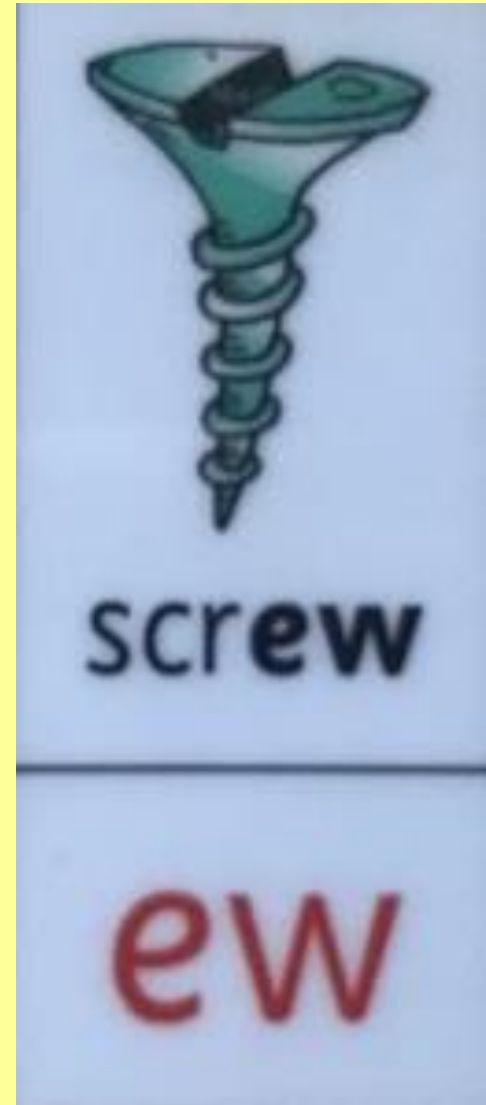
Where in the word?

ew

The /ew/ phoneme usually comes at the end of words.

blew

ue

The /ue/ phoneme usually comes at the end of words.





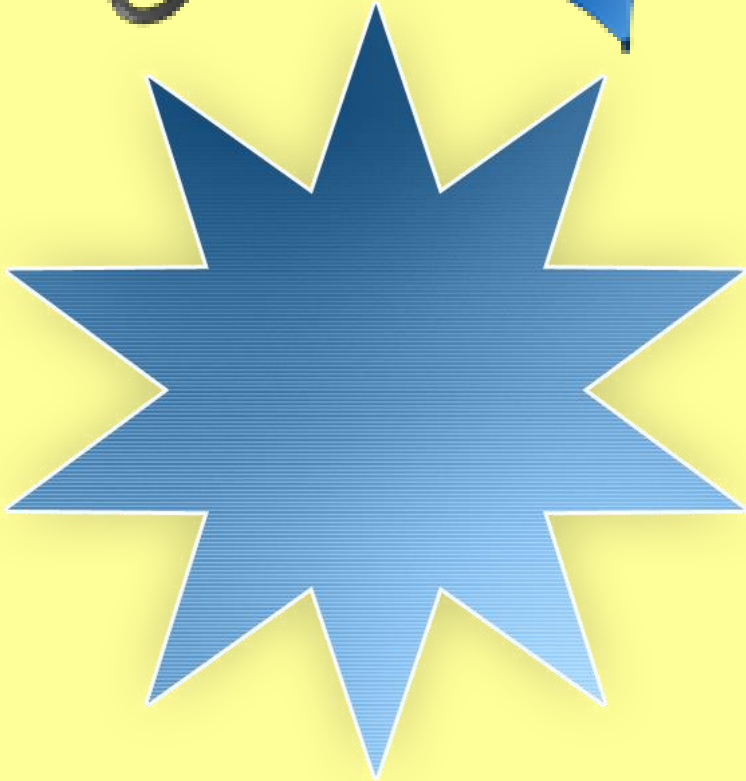

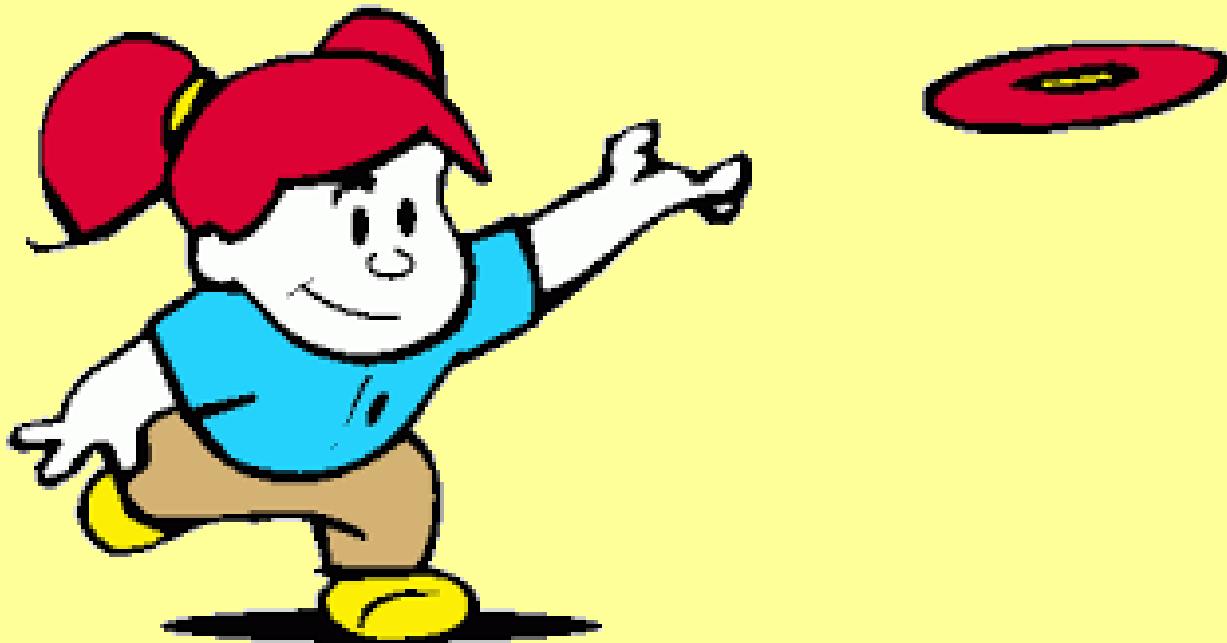
