

English Tasks – The Wild West

This week we are going to start learning about The Wild West.

We are going to find out:

- Find out why people moved to America
- Discover what a real cowboy would have done and what their life was like
- Find out about a Saloon
- Find out the code of the West



Monday:

Read through the Whole Class Reading words which contains key topic words for the non fiction text we are going to read tomorrow. Use it just like you would in the classroom, create an action for each word! When you have read all the words, in your book, write each word in bubble writing and draw a picture that will help you remember the word.

Read the nonfiction text after you have finished the vocabulary PowerPoint.

Tuesday – Live Session

We are going to find out some more information about The Wild West. We will also read and talk about the non fiction text together on our Tuesday Zoom. Your Zoom teacher will then ask you to complete the questions. Please don't complete the reading questions before the Zoom!

Wednesday – Live Session

We are going to find out some more information about cowboys to write a persuasive poster to encourage people to emigrate to America. Your poster will be put up all across Britain. You must advertise America, becoming a cowboy/cowgirl and tell people the benefits of moving there. We will be looking at rhetorical questions, imperative verbs and expanded noun phrases in our Zoom to include on your poster.

Thursday –

Today we would like you to write your persuasive poster advertising North America and the Wild West. In your poster can you think about answering:

Why is there a better life in the Wild West?

Why is the land better in America?

What could people work as when they get to America?

What could you wear?

What sports events could you join?
