Today we are going to look at the split vowel digraphs 'a-e' and 'o-e'.





What are the 5 vowels?

The 5 vowels are: a, e, i, o and u

There are short vowel sounds e.g in the words:

tap sam mad

 There are also long vowel sounds (the long vowel sounds are also the names of the letters). This is when we use the split vowel digraph and add the 'e' at the end of the word.

e.g tape same made Have a think about these words with short vowel sounds 'o':

hop rob not
