Number:
Use number cards 1-5 from the ones you have made. Place them face down. Pick up one card and get that many toy cars/teddies. Pick up another card and get that many small bricks/balls. How many toys have you got altogether? Can you draw pictures to represent what you have done? Repeat this each day a few times. Do this with other numbers – you could use number cards to 10.
