Key Words – Javan Rhinos

Your child will have just watched a lesson about Javan Rhinos. Their activity was to listen out for the key words in the video that were highlighted in yellow.

You will need to ask them what each of the following words mean and see how much they can remember about them from the video. If they can talk around the word's meaning and it's context with Rhinos, that would demonstrate great articulation!

Endangered: Where there are not many of a certain type of animal or species left, and they are close to becoming extinct.

Poachers: People that trap the Rhinos and sometimes hurt them.

Dung: Poo (It helps us to know what Rhinos eat, and where they have been)

Disease: A bug or virus that makes people and animals sick. Rhinos may go extinct from disease.

Educating: To teach someone something new. WWF want to educate people and the government on how we can protect the Rhinos

Donations: Giving something to another person for free, like money to a charity. The WWF need donations to keep the charity going.

Extinct: Where there are no more of a type of animal/species left in the world. This means there cannot be any more of this creature. Rhinos could become extinct if we do not save them.
