Taught input and independent task	<p>Read Alfie's Star story.</p> <p>Complete the quiz time activity to check your understanding of the story.</p> <p>Then complete Alfie's Star Story Mountain activity to sequence the events in the story.</p>	<p>Re-read the story Alfie's Star from yesterday.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Think of 3 words (or more!) to describe what a star looks like e.g 'bright'. Write them into your home learning book. 2. Now write 3 or more words to describe what they do e.g 'shine'. 3. <i>Now think about where you might see stars e.g 'on top of a Christmas tree'.</i> 4. <i>Finally, put your ideas together in to a 5-tick sentence! For example:</i> A bright star shines on top of a Christmas tree and makes everybody smile! <p>Aim to write at least 3-5 good 5-tick sentences!</p> <p>(Sentences must have a capital letter, full stop, finger spaces, conjunction eg. and/because and it must make sense).</p>	<p>Today we are starting a new Talk for Writing unit in English which we will be continuing in school over the next few weeks. The focus is description.</p> <p>Have a look at the picture here or on the webpage. Tell somebody at home what you can see and what is happening.</p> <p>Make a mind map of <i>nouns</i> (the object or thing in the picture) and <i>adjectives</i> (describing words) to describe the nouns. (see example here).</p> <p>Now think about what could be happening in the picture. What might the children be saying to each other? What is happening?</p> <p>Write some descriptive 5-tick sentences about what is happening in the picture.</p> <p>***Please can children bring this piece of work in to school on Friday.***</p>	*This lesson will be taught on Zoom*
