Greek Gods

When all the cards are finished, you're ready to play the game!

1. Share the cards between the number of players.
2. The players keep their cards in a pile in the same order.
3. Each player looks at one of their cards at a time.
4. The first player chooses the category they think their card is strongest on, and reads it out.
5. All players share the score on their card for that category.
6. The player with the highest score wins all of the cards, which they put at the bottom of their pile. It is this player's turn to pick the next category.
