The phonemes/sounds of the week are:

ay	ou	ea
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Start by getting your child to say each digraph (2 letters making one sound) in turn and then change the order. The aim is for your child to say the correct digraph sound when they see it. This will help develop their reading.

To improve your child's skills further, help your child read and sort the 'ay' words into real and unreal words. Make sure they are blending all the sounds together to read the word correctly. Colour the real words in one colour and the unreal words in another.

Play a game of 'ou' dominoes together. Cut out the dominoes and share them between 2. Practice blending the word as you put them down - match the pictures to the correct word as you play.

Phase 5 Real and Nonsense Words for ay

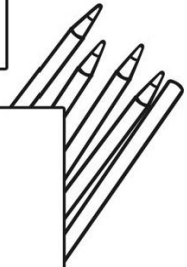
There are many different words spelt with 'ay'.
