Key People	
	<b>Lewis Heymann</b> One of the key people responsible for the development of lace in Nottingham. Became Mayor of Nottingham.
	<b>Albert Heymann</b> Lewis' son who was a banker and gave lots of money to charities. He also became Mayor of Nottingham like his father.

## The Lace Industry in Nottingham

Before 1760, all lace and fabric was made at home.










After 1760, machines were invented to make cloth. They used steam power so were much quicker.











This led to factories being built where big machines were used and needed lots of people to work there. The production of lace started.





The lace industry grew and became big in Nottingham creating an area called the Lace Market.

Lots of people moved to Nottingham to work in the lace factories. This resulted in over crowding and poor living conditions.

<b>Industry</b> 	The process of turning raw materials into finished products, or a particular business that does this.	<b>Sources</b> 	Something that provides information about the past.  Primary source—was created by people or things in that time period—physical thing.  Secondary source –interprets and analyses primary source. May contain pictures, quotes or graphics from the past.
<b>Lace</b> 	A delicate fabric made either by machine or hand		
<b>Decade</b> 	A period of 10 years.		
<b>Century</b> 	A period of 100 years.		
<b>AD</b> 	Stands for Anno Domini. This means the year of the lord and all the years that come after it. It counts forward.	<b>Significance</b> 	The quality of being important.
		<b>Impact</b> 	Have a strong effect on someone or something.
		<b>Invention</b> 	The action of creating something new or adapting to improve.
<b>BC</b> 	Stands for Before Christ. This means the years that came before 0. It counts backwards.		

<b>West Bridgford Hall</b> —Lewis Heymann lived here and Albert Heymann later bought the hall to live there. Albert also bought the 19 acres that is now West Bridgford park	
	<b>1850— Painting</b> Lewis Heymann lived at the Hall when it was owned by John Musters.
	<b>1890—Black and white picture</b> Albert Heymann lived there after buying it from the musters family.
	<b>1925— Picture in sepia</b> After Albert Heymann sold the hall to the council. They used it for offices and turned the land into Bridgford Park.
	<b>2023— Picture</b> The Hall is now used fir wedding ceremonies and offices. Very popular wedding venue. There are apartments for people to stay in.
