**Lewis Heymann** One of the key people responsible for the development of lace in Nottingham. Became Mayor of Nottingham.



Albert Heymann Lewis' son who was a banker and gave lots of money to charities. He also became Mayor of Nottingham like his father.

### The Lace Industry in Nottingham

Before 1760, all lace and fabric was made at home.

After 1760. machines were invented to make cloth. They used steam power so were much quicker.

This lead to factories being built where big machines were used and needed lots of people to work there. The production of lace started.
