

Different Types of Farming			
Dairy	Farms that keep cattle (cows) for milk are called dairy farms. They are usually in wet parts of the country, mostly in the west, where there is enough fresh grass for the animals.		
Livestock	Hilly areas are often rocky and cold, which makes them unsuitable for growing crops. Usually, it is used for sheep and cattle grazing.		
Arable	Land in flat areas with rich soil which is used for growing crops. This is called arable farming and often, farmers use heavy machinery to look after and harvest the crops. Arable farming is usually in the east of the UK.		




